



Swine flu or Influenza being a dreadful disease which caused a major fear among the common people of India across various strata of society. It is the most recent pandemic diseases that have rapidly affected the World's Population. Malwa Region was also witnessing a swine flu outbreak with significant morbidity and mortality. Therefore, taking this into consideration 43 v o l u n t e e r s of NCC Unit accompanied by Er. Navjot Singh (Coordinator of NSS/NCC) organized a One-day visit on dated October 17, 2017 at Village Kot Bhai, Dist. Shri Muktsar Sahib with collaboration of Gram Panchayat (Village Kot Bhai) for the Awareness Campaign against Swine flu with the help of Gram Panchayat.

The camp started with an introductory session about the visit and introduction with Mr. Sukhdeep Singh (Sarpanch, Village Kot Bhai) along with other Panchayat Members. After seeking permission, our volunteers managed to divide themselves into 04 groups, and all the groups were accompanied by the faculty members & representatives of the Gram Panchayat. The v o l u n t e e r s visited each member of the house in the village and guided them about this fatal infection. They highlighted the symptoms and preventive measures they should take in order to save themselves from Swine Flu. They made them aware that it is necessary that a person having symptoms of swine flu like high fever, cough, etc., should not come in direct contact with other people. Being a contagious disease, it spreads from one person to another, thus patients of swine flu need to be kept isolated from others. Awareness messages were conveyed to different audiences such as older people, pregnant women, and young children, and were disseminated via posters, fact sheets, and adverts in local languages. Besides, the volunteers identified a few needy families and gave them medicines also. In the end, Mr. Sukhdeep also addressed the gathering and paid his sincere thanks to all the volunteers and Baba Farid College of Engineering & Technology regarding social work and appealed to all to follow the necessary preventive measures to stop this flu. Overall, the whole volunteer group actively participated in making the community awareness against Swine Flu and helped this small initiative to become a grand success.

Gender inequality constitutes one of history's most persistent and widespread forms of injustice. By eliminating it, we not only make progress on Sustainable Development Goals, we also make gains on the alleviation of poverty and fuel sustainable economic growth. In the same row, to eliminate all forms of discrimination and violence against women in the public and private spheres and to undertake reforms to give women equal rights to economic resources and access to ownership of property about 23 volunteers of the NCC unit participated in one-day awareness seminar on Women Rights at Village, Daula (Distt: Bathinda) in Collaboration with Gram Panchayat under Gender Equity on September 11, 2017. As it has been a very sensitive topic since the ancient era. Students interacted with the Sarpanch, Gram Panchayat & discussed the purpose behind the visit i.e. to understand the various gender issues in the rural areas, to analyze the existing laws and prepare legal professionals to contribute for the future. They were highly appreciated for their initiative. Sarpanch, Gram Panchayat said such kinds of seminars and sessions really enhance motivation among the youth. He requested to the coordinator and faculty members to arrange such events at short intervals so as to aware the people in rural community about such topics. He also managed to call around 33 men & women within a short span of time at the Committee Hall.

Er. Jayoti Arora Bansal (Dean Academics) also addressed the gathering about the severe gender issues such as Gender Equity, Female Literacy Rate, and Equal Voting Rights etc. for changing people's attitude, mind sets by means of accepting and allowing women who are of the decision-making process, into it. While addressing, she also said that Gender Equality is not only a fundamental human right but a necessary foundation for a peaceful and sustainable world. The exclusion of women places half of the world's population outside the realm of opportunity to partner in building prosperous societies and economics. Equal access to education and health, decent work, and representation in political and economic



decision-making processes are not only rights that women should have, they also benefit humanity at large. She also urged that every individual in our society yearns for equal status, opportunity, and rights. In her address, she explained that the implementation of new legal frameworks regarding female equality in the workplace and the eradication of harmful practices targeted at women is crucial to ending the gender-based discrimination prevalent in society. She stressed upon students to motivate those children who not go to school toward education as students played very important role in war of independence and revolution offreedom, she added. Shesaid there was a time when Women were not allowed to vote.

Er Amandeep Singh paid his sincere thanks to the Gram Panchayat for allowing them to interact with the people and all who listened to the volunteers with a keen interest & patience.
